The Building Committee was busy throughout the year. Asbestos abatement began. We reduced the scope of the project based on anticipated finances. Beginning in January 2024, much more work will be happening. We anticipate the facility improvement project to be done by November of 2024.










GROW *Disciples*

In anticipation of the completion of the two-year Emerge initiative, we used the Congregation Assessment Tool (CAT) to let every voice at Concordia be heard as we plan for the future. We learned from the CAT that Concordia is a transformational church, with high energy and high satisfaction. Priorities moving forward are relationships, equipping, and growth in outreach. We used the CAT, along with conversations and prayers in smaller groups, including our Council and staff, to develop a renewed vision, mission, and re-statement of our core values. Students

Concordia has always been dedicated to offering an enthusiastic youth ministry. The dedication to revitalize this program and the involvement of youth of all ages is a priority for many members and staff alike.

-  26.5% of our Operating Budget was allocated to support parochial education
-  18 students attended LCMS Missouri District Youth Gathering in March
-  17 students participated in a Servant Trip to Alabama & Tennessee in June
-  Weekly High School Student Ministry Activities were added on Sundays
-  36 Sixth Graders enrolled in Concordia Confirmation in August
-  Youth Ministry was re-branded as Student Ministry for clarity for new families with Middle School, High School, and College Students
-  Established a framework for creating new small group Bible studies, new groups launching in 2024

GO *to Local Neighbors*

Night to Shine was back in person! 130 honored guests, their families, and approximately 300 volunteers — many of which had no prior connection to Concordia.

Our Student Ministry ventured through the community for Random Acts of Kindness. They left notes inspired by God's love, small gifts, flowers, and even detergent at the laundry mat.

A lively and festive multi-generational group strolled through Downtown Kirkwood singing Christmas carols in December.

Vacation Bible School is a wonderful way to invite young members of the community to our church to experience the message of Jesus through a week of fun, games, songs, and fellowship. This year, we also hosted a family night where all parents and siblings were invited to a fun evening with an inflatable obstacle course, games, music, snacks, and more!

We continued to further connections with Bethlehem in North St. Louis and various other service events to benefit our neighborhoods.

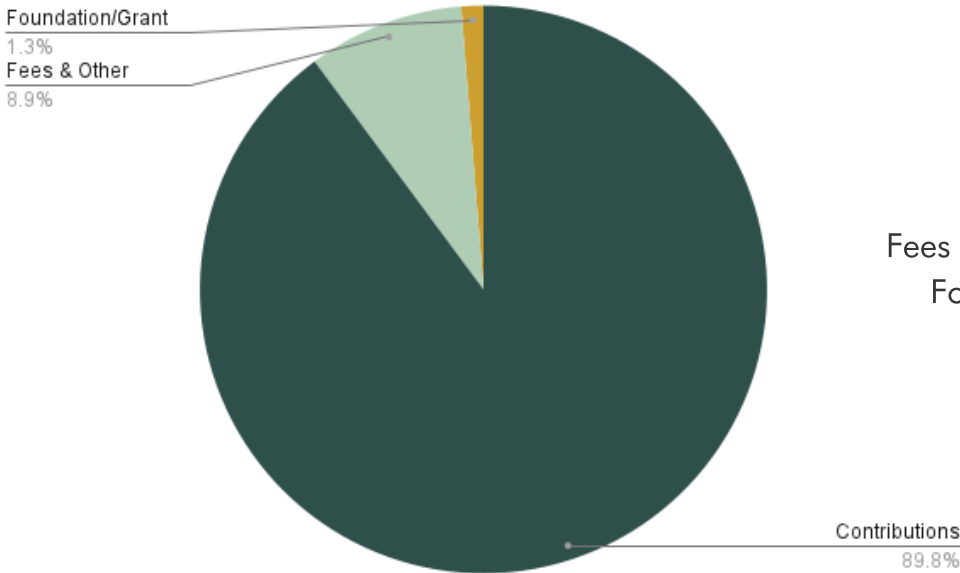
GO *International Neighbors*

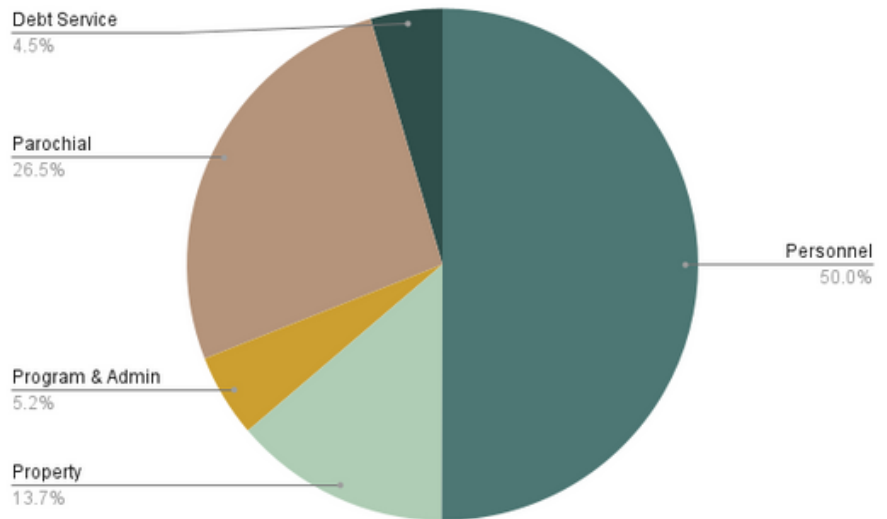

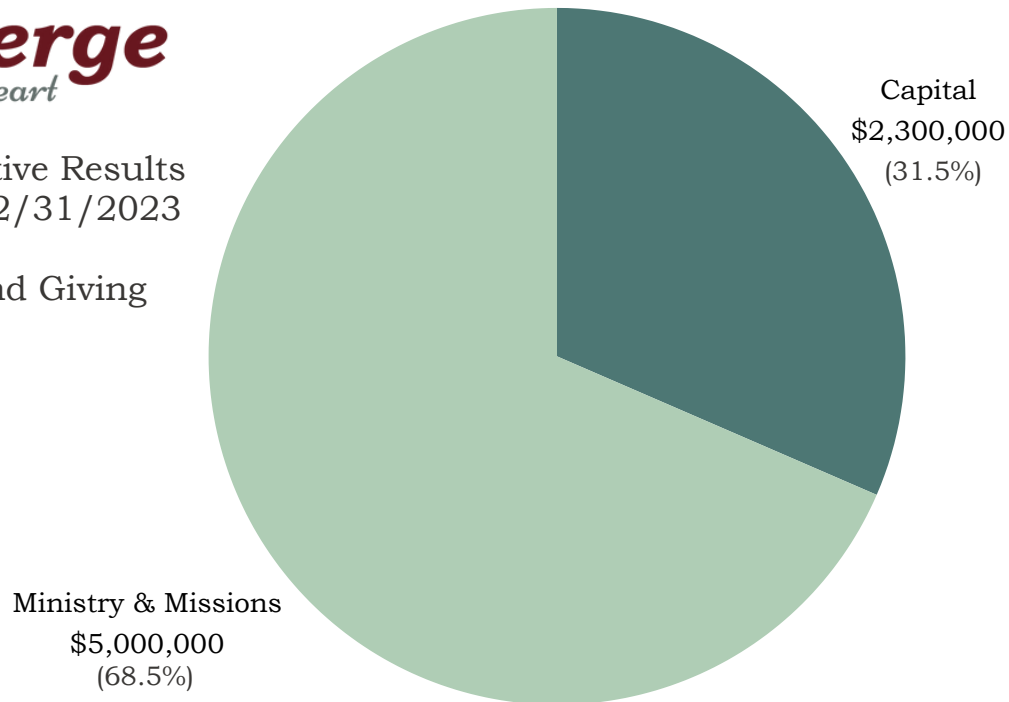
Generosity

Over the past two years our congregation Emerged with one heart to Renew, Grow and Go. We've completed the two-year Emerge giving initiative which inspired us to fully fund on-going ministry, missions, and provide \$2.3M in capital funding for renovating our facilities. We are planning the following renovations in 2024:

- Removing the old school building providing green space
- Build rooftop patio
- Upgrade facility exterior
- Facility wide upgraded fire suppression and fire detection system
- New carpeting in atrium stairwell, Concordia Commons, Sanctuary Commons and rooftop entry
- New ceilings, lighting and paint throughout the construction area
- Updated HVAC units
